Banff Mountain Film Festival was on at the Leamington Spa Centre in March, a series of short captivating films made by the world's top outdoor adventure filmakers. All featuring extreme journeys, intriguing characters and stunning cinematography.

Included in the films were mountain biking on the edge of steep drops in the Dolomites, canoeing down glacier rivers and waterfalls in Svalbard, trad climbing on a notoriously difficult Colorado sport route, a spectacular freestyle mountain bike hurtling down an Austrian ski race route - it was genuinely thrilling to watch.

My favourite film of the evening was "Soul Flyers" that followed a descent which began with three "adventurers" leaping out of a helicopter over Mont Blanc, stretching out their wing suits and making the longest ever descent from 12000 feet, travelling 7.5km - like flying squirrels! these guys were having so much fun that they even found time to do aerobatics, flipping on to their backs and flying upside down for a while - it was awesome to watch!

Despite what has been the least wintery winter in recent memory, a winter trip to Scotland at the end of February experienced some snowy weather, which even prompted an avalanche on on Ben Nevis a couple of days before arrival!

Despite the conditions, the climbers managed to get their ice axes and crampons out, experienced some adventures on the hill and a good time was had by all. In Scotland there's always the whisky afterwards, so sometimes all that effort is just worth it to sit by an open fire with a glass or two!

Our most recent trip to the Peak district was blessed with changeable Spring weather, with plenty of climbers, first time outdoors and experienced, coming up for one of the first non-snowy climbing trips of the year.

There are plenty more trips lined up for 2025, so do take a look at one or two (or more), most have the option of staying in a climbers hut, so you don't even need camping gear! All will be great fun, so sign up, and see you on the rock.

Here's what's coming up in May, June and July:

2 – 5 May, Wye Valley Single and multi-pitch limestone, trad and sport.

24 May – 1 Jun, Cornwall Single– and multi-pitch granite on the glorious Cornish coast.

20 – 22 Jun, Peak District Single-pitch limestone or grit in a moorland setting.

11 – 13 Jul Yorkshire Single-pitch limestone or grit in the beautiful Yorkshire Dales.

This is by no means an exhaustive list. If you have further questions then speak with an experienced member of the club and read online. The BMC and UK Climbing provide a lot of useful information on their websites.

Experience	Expectation	Equipment
Climbing outside (trad and sport)	A confident indoor climber (grade 5 upwards) who wants to know what it's really about.	Helmet (essential), nut key (trad only), 120cm sling, 2x locking carabiners, a length of prusik cord (ask a WCC member). (~£100) These items are required for seconding on traditional ("Trad") and sport routes.

Everyone on the Committee is super excited to see what can be done! However, we do need club volunteers to help prepare the wall, for this once in a generation opportunity!

If the Committee decides to go ahead, there will be a call on Whatsapp for WCC climbers to help with these stages:

- A "route setting Sunday" in the near future to undo, measure and record bolt lengths. Then refit every hold currently mounted to the wall, and check spare bolt holes for dodgy threads
- A total wall strip by volunteers on a Wednesday night
- A jet wash party, to clean all the holds in advance of the final installation
- A small team will be required for a whole day to assist our professional route setter so he can stay focused on reaching the summit.

The result will be awesome, so come along if you can and get involved!
