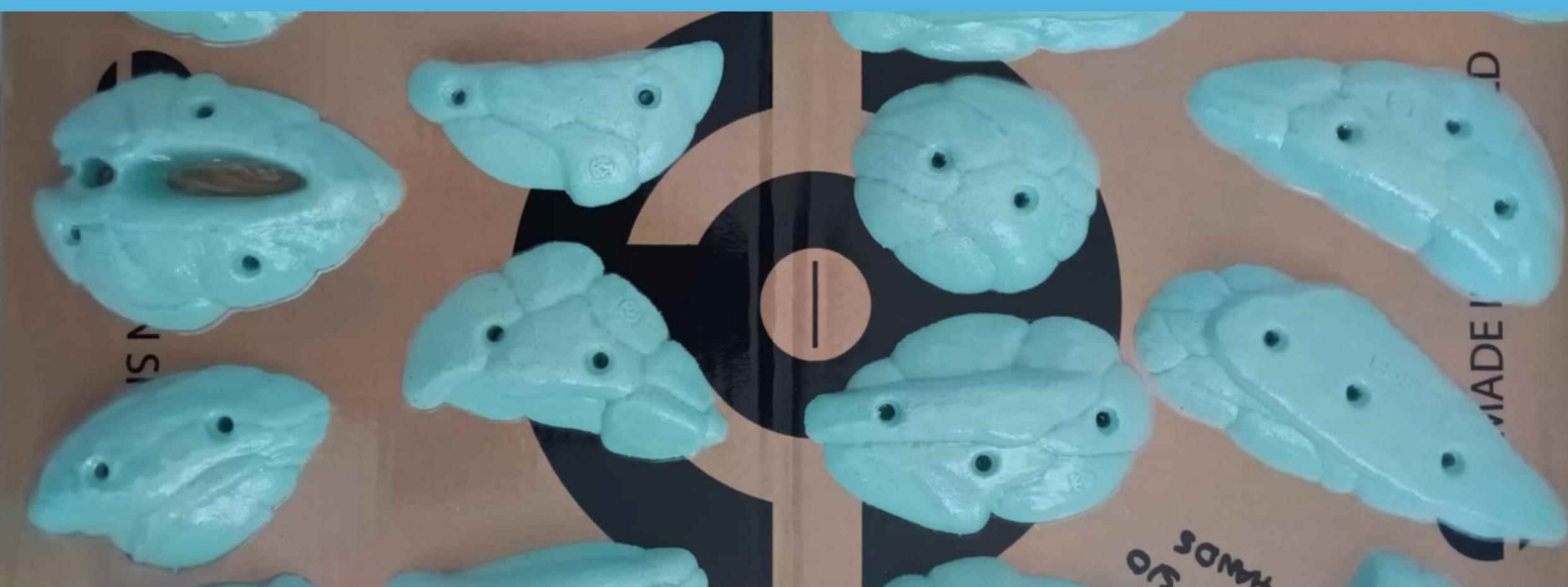

These are being set by Rich Winters, a top route setter who has worked all across the country and knows how to create amazing routes, up to Grade 8.

On Wednesday 6th August all the existing wall holds will be stripped off, and our new routes will be set on Sunday 10th, ready for the following weekly climbing session.

We need club members to come to St. Nicks on Wednesday evening, 6th August, and help prepare the wall ! Also, please come down on Sunday 10th to support the route setting. Look out for Whatsapp and email nearer the time, and please reply if you can make it.

The more the merrier, we can get the job done sooner and celebrate!

Hold, Hold, more Holds

A massive amount of background work has taken place over the last few weeks at the St. Nicks wall, getting ready for the Big Reset, across 12 wall panels totalling 15.4m wide by 5.5m tall.

Ian Stokes and Ruby Sinclair led the efforts with club members in checking everything on the wall; holds, bolts and holes. Thanks to all club members who got involved, running bolts into every unused t-nut.

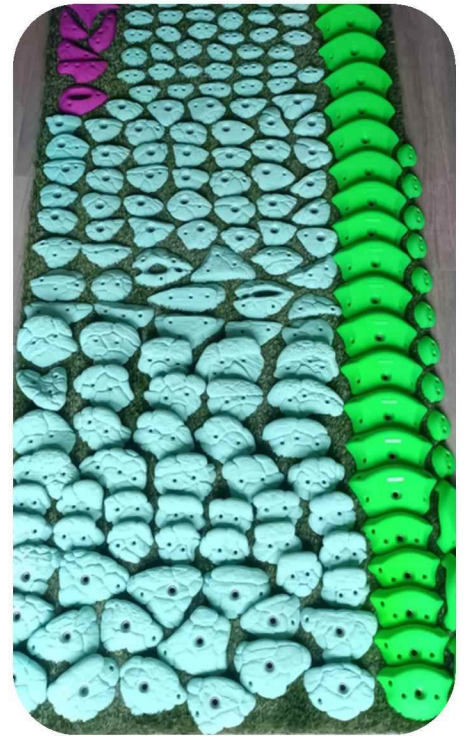
A total of 34 imperial bolts were identified and removed from the wall. These had damaged t-nuts in the wall that have since been repaired and brought back into service. This gives us a total number of 1455 potential bolt on hold placements!

311 holds have been removed from the wall and the storage box, and have all been jet washed. The bolt spec and screw lengths specified are now marked on the back of every hold.

There are 669 bolt-on holds on the wall, these will all be jet washed and spec marked after they are stripped on 6th August, before the Big Reset.

The club have now received 272 new holds, a 28% increase on our total current hold count of 980. 100 new bolts and 2700 new KTX screws will finish the job off !
